The goal of my research is to advance our understanding of the ways in which sport can be a positive transformative experience that enables participants to develop their potential in a safe and healthy manner. Within this, I primarily explore the ways in which people can be influenced to use, misuse, abuse, and abstain from the use of image and performance-enhancing drugs, substances, and methods. The outcome of my research has implications for sport policy and program design and implementation. As I am interested in the development of human potential, I also critically examine sport development policies and practices, while challenging the assumptions that pervade sport, so that sport can be better designed and placed to deliver on its promise as a true benefit to society.
